Please match the correct description with the twenty-six people listed below.

1. The first wife of Ahasuerus, king of Persia. *Esther 1:9-19; 2:1, 4, 17*
2. A contemporary of King Solomon's who came to Jerusalem with gold and precious stones. *I Kings 10:1, 2*
3. King of Judah at the time Sennacherib's Assyrian army withdrew from Jerusalem after a plague spread killing many in their tents. *II Kings 19:15, 35*
4. A prophet, a judge and a priest born to Hannah but raised by his teacher, Eli.  
*I Samuel 1:20*
5. A woman whose jar of grain and jug of oil are replenished thanks to the prophet Elijah during a time of drought. *I Kings 17:8-16*
6. An early Christian from Cyprus who traveled with Paul. *Acts 4:36, 37*
7. Joseph married Asenath in Egypt. Manasseh was Joseph's older son. Please name the second son. *Genesis 41:52*
8. A prophetess and a judge who prevailed in a battle with the Canaanites.  
*Judges 4:4*
9. One of Noah's three sons. His brothers were Shem and Ham. *Genesis 5:32*
10. Rebekah's brother. His daughters included Leah and Rachel. *Genesis 29:10*
11. An officer of Pharaoh's and a captain of the guard. Joseph was sold to him. *Genesis 37:36*
12. A writing prophet of Israel who lived in Jerusalem. He was married and had two sons. *Isaiah 7:3; 8:3*
13. Daughter of King Saul and first wife of David. *I Samuel 14:49*
14. King of the Persian Empire who allowed the Hebrew people to return to Jerusalem after the Exile. *Ezra 1:14*

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15. Brother of Moses and Miriam. He and his four sons were solemnly consecrated to the priesthood by being anointed with oil. *I Chronicles 6:3*
16. A son of Solomon and first king of the Southern Kingdom, Judah, founded at the time of Solomon's death. *I Kings 11:43*
17. The Babylonian king who captured and destroyed Jerusalem in 587 BCE. His army took the Hebrew people into captivity. *II Kings, chapters 24, 25*
18. A slave belonging to Philemon, a member of the church at Colossae. Paul writes about him in his letter to Philemon. *Philemon 1:10*
19. The father of John the Baptist. *Luke 1:-525, 57-79; 3:2*
20. An early Christian who worked with Paul. He was often sent to churches when Paul himself could not go. His mother was Eunice and his grandmother was Lois. *Philemon 1:1*
21. A Roman governor of Judea mentioned in Acts. He was married to Drusilla and kept Paul in prison. *Acts 23:23 to 24:27*
22. A king of Judah, the Southern Kingdom, who reigned for 52 years and was struck with leprosy later in life. *II Chronicles 26:3*
23. A son of Jesse who began his career as a shepherd and became king of Israel.  
*I Samuel 16:17-23*
24. Another name for Moses, who was the son of "a man of the house of Levi."  
*Exodus 2:1*
25. One of the twelve sons of Jacob. His mother was Zilpah and his younger brother was Asher. *Genesis 30:10, 11*
26. Nobleman's son who was sick at Capernaum. *John 4:46-53*
